(wiggle the body like a snake)



“He went to bed, all curled up small”
(curl up and pretend to go to sleep)

- Children can recite the rhyme and do the actions to “Wriggling William”

- They can wiggle through tunnels or boxes with no ends; just like “William the snake”

- They can wiggle and wiggle about the space to music - on backs, fronts, sides and feet

- They can draw and paint “Wriggling William”

“Then wiggled and came out to play” *(wiggle along the ground)*
